I have known you and your service TASA, since I became a lawyer almost 18 years ago. I have used your service time and again when my firm was literally stumped, and could not find any expert in a particular field or professional specialty.

Almost unanimously, the attorneys and doctors who have listened to Dr. Hendler lecture on diagnosing and treating patients with chronic pain, have requested him to return as a lecturer.
